The major's built-in flexibility provides students with a highly marketable degree, one that's now better than ever following the creation of three new concentrations: **Management**, **Policy and Law**, and **Production**.

Management



The **Management** concentration is designed for students seeking careers in management, marketing, finance, and other areas with top agribusiness firms.

Students can choose electives from a wide range of business interests to prepare them to make an immediate impact with these employers.

Policy and Law



The **Policy and Law** concentration prepares students for placement in the public sector or to enter law school. Courses in this concentration provide students with the critical thinking and writing skills needed for successful careers in agricultural policy or law. Students in the Policy and Law concentration have completed internships in Washington, DC, with government agencies and members of Congress.

Production



The **Production** concentration readies students who want to manage their own agricultural operations, or consult those who do. Through the available electives, students can focus on their area of interest in agriculture. Students are encouraged to seek minors in other departments in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences.

Scholarships

Students majoring in **Agribusiness** are eligible for consideration for College of Agriculture and Life Sciences (CALs) and Department of Agricultural Economics scholarships, as well as University-wide scholarships.

Students should complete and submit the CALs scholarship application form by the deadline date of February 1 for consideration for both CALs and Departmental scholarships.

While all applications are considered on a case-by-case basis, almost all scholarships require a minimum GPA of 3.0. Scholarships for entering freshmen consider a student's high school GPA. Eligibility criteria on specific scholarships are available from the Undergraduate Coordinator.

Admission to the degree program

Admission to the Department's **Agribusiness** program requires admission to **Mississippi State University**. Specific requirements and an online application can be obtained from www.admissions.msstate.edu. In addition to completing the application, the application process requires a non-refundable application fee, submitting official ACT or SAT test scores, official copies of high school and/or college transcripts, and proof of immunizations.
