Minor in Agribusiness

The Department of Agricultural Economics offers a minor in Agribusiness to provide students with a foundation in applied economic analysis and business management to enhance their potential career opportunities. Only students with majors outside the Department of Agricultural Economics are eligible for the minor in Agribusiness.

A minor in Agribusiness is attained by completing at least 18 hours of Agribusiness courses. To qualify for a minor, students must maintain a 2.0 average or better in courses taken to satisfy the requirements for the minor. Students may choose among the following (please note that students are responsible for satisfying appropriate prerequisites):

Required (6 hours):

- AEC 2713 Introduction to Food and Resource Economics (or EC 2123 Principles of Microeconomics)
- AEC 3133 Introductory Agribusiness Management

In addition, choose at least four (4) of the following (12 hours):

- AEC 3213 International Trade in Agriculture
- AEC 3413 Introduction to Food Marketing
- AEC 4113 Agribusiness Firm Management
- AEC 4123 Financial and Commodity Futures Marketing
- AEC 4133 Food Markets and Prices
- AEC 4343 Advanced Farm Management
- AEC 4413 Public Problems of Agriculture
- Other approved AEC elective

Students are responsible for satisfying all prerequisites before registering for courses. A grade of C or better must be earned in each course to be counted toward the minor.
